BRIDGING THE WORLD THROUGH MUSIC

In-Person Syllabus (RCM & Special)

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. General

- 1.1 The festival proceedings shall be under the sole management of the Chinese Cultural Centre of Greater Toronto (the "CCC") and the CCC Toronto International Music Festival Committee (the "Festival Committee").
- 1.2 All matters not covered in these rules shall be referred to the Festival Committee, whose decisions on such matters shall be final and binding.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 The CCC Toronto International Music Festival (the "CCCTIMF") is open to participants regardless of their residence or nationality.
- 2.2 Only participants who are not signed to a major record label company and/or its affiliates or subsidiaries are eligible to apply for the festival.
- 2.3 No age limits will be imposed except where indicated. Age is determined as of January 1st, 2024. CCCTIMF reserves the right to ask for proof of age.
- 2.4 Adjudicators of CCCTIMF are not allowed to register their students in their adjudicated classes if they are having, or have had during the preceding FOUR years, a familial, teaching, or professional relationship with the students.
- 2.5 Refer to the In-Person Special Syllabus for class-specific eligibility and requirements.

3. Registration

- 3.1 CCCTIMF reserves the right to accept or reject any registration in its sole discretion.
- 3.2 Participants can register for classes based on two syllabi, namely the In-Person Royal Conservatory of Music (RCM) syllabus and the In-Person Special syllabus.
- 3.3 Registration is ONLY accepted online, via the CCCTIMF festival website (<u>www.ccctimf.org</u>).





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- 3.4 Participants may enter as many different classes as they wish but may only enter once in each class.
- 3.5 The same repertoire can be used in multiple classes, e.g. the same recording for a Bach movement can be used as one of the pieces in both the Young Artist Class and the Bach Class.
- 3.6 Participants may enter only one age level in each In-Person Special syllabus class.

4. Fees and Deadline

- 4.1 A completed online registration form, payment and all required documents must be received by CCCTIMF by September 20, 2024, 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time (EST).
- 4.2 All late registrations are subject to a late registration fee of \$20 CAD per day and will only be accepted within one week after the official registration deadline.
- 4.3 All fees must be paid upon registration through the CCCTIMF festival website using a credit card or through PayPal.
- 4.4 All fees are <u>non-refundable</u>.
- 4.5 Class fee varies and is listed for each class in the 2024 syllabi.

5. Repertoire

- 5.1 For CCCTIMF RCM In-person syllabus, the festival will only accept repertoire from the current official RCM Syllabi. Unlike the RCM rules, CCCTIMF does not allow popular selections to be used in etude classes; and does not allow "Repertoire Substitution" and "Teacher's Choice" for the respective grades as mentioned in the RCM syllabus.
- 5.2 Participants must perform the piece(s) as stated on their entry form.
- 5.3 It is of utmost importance to state the timing for each repertoire performance correctly on the registration form. It is the sole responsibility of the applicant to ensure correct class codes and timings are entered on the registration form. No changes of classes or repertoire are allowed after the application is submitted.



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- 5.4 Participants must bring the music scores to CCCTIMF for the adjudicators. CCCTIMF abides by the copyright law of Canada, and any participant who does not will be disqualified.
- 5.5 Festival pieces are to be performed without repeats (with the exception of Da Capo). If participants have a compelling reason to play the repeats, they may do so with prior approval from the CCCTIMF Artistic Committee.
- 5.6 Unless otherwise stated in the syllabi, festival pieces are expected to be performed from memory. Any work performed with sheet music will receive comments only and will not qualify for prizes.
- 5.7 No changes of repertoire are allowed after the application is submitted.

6. Festival Procedures

- 6.1 Adjudicators' decisions are final and in their sole discretion. Each participant is judged based on the highest artistic standards of musicianship, interpretation, technical proficiency, and stage presentation. The Adjudicator reserves the right not to award any or all prizes. Parents, teachers, or participants may not approach the Adjudicator in person, via email or social media at any time; this may result in disqualification of the participant. CCCTIMF reserves the right to substitute or appoint additional Adjudicators at any time at its sole discretion.
- 6.2 The festival schedule will not be changed to accommodate piano accompanists. Neither special scheduling requests nor any changes will be considered.
- 6.3 Participants and piano accompanists (if applicable) must arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their scheduled class.
- 6.4 Participants must dress formally/semi-formally.
- 6.5 Participants who arrive after the last performance of the class will not be allowed to perform.





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- 6.6 No rehearsal at the competition venue is allowed.
- 6.7 Participants must provide their own piano accompanist for all violin classes, excluding the unaccompanied pieces.
- 6.8 Works with orchestral accompaniment must be played on a second piano.
- 6.9 The adjudicator may, at his/her discretion, interrupt a performance when his/her assessment has been finalized.
- 6.10 Any complaints must be submitted in writing to the Festival Committee.
- 6.11 Participants are allowed to record their own performances for archival purposes. It is forbidden to take photographs, audio and/or video recording of another participant's performance.
- 6.12 All cell phones and pagers must be turned off during sessions. No food/drink is permitted in the performance hall.
- 6.13 Other than members of the Festival Committee, no participants, parents, or members of the public may converse with the adjudicators during the festival.

7. Evaluation and Results (except the Master Class)

- 7.1 Each participant will receive a Comment sheet(s) with mark(s) as assigned.
- 7.2 A minimum mark of 85% and above is required for First-place medallion, a minimum mark of 83% and above is required for Second-place medallion; and a minimum mark of 80% is required for Third-place medallion.
- 7.3 The festival results will be published on <u>www.ccctimf.org</u>.





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8. Awards

- 8.1 To qualify for a Signature trophy, scholarship and OMFA Provincial level nomination, participants must enter and perform in at least 3 classes and fulfill other requirements of the trophy awards.
- 8.2 Trophies or medals will be awarded to the winners of each class.
- 8.3 Certificates for First, Second and Third places will be issued after the completion of each class.
- 8.4 All other participants will receive certificates of appreciation after the completion of each class.
- 8.5 For Signature trophy details in the In-Person Special syllabus, please refer to the Award Eligibility list.
- 8.6 Scholarships will be awarded to selected Signature trophy winners and first prize winners of Young Artist classes.
- 8.7 Past CCC Music Festival/ CCCTIMF grand trophy winners within 3 years are not eligible for the festival's grand trophy again.

9. CBSO Soloist Opportunity

- 9.1 The CCCTIMF Grand Trophy winner(s) and the Concerto Class winners of the festival may have an opportunity to be invited to perform as a soloist with the Cathedral Bluffs Symphony Orchestra with Maestro Martin MacDonald in a future concert in the CBSO's regular concert series (www.cathedralbluffs.com)
 - The CCCTIMF Grand Trophy winner(s) and the Concerto Class winners are automatically eligible to be considered for the concert soloist engagement. No registration is required.
 - All Online classes will not be considered for this opportunity.
 - CBSO Artistic Director shall select one or more soloist(s) from the winner pool for concert soloist engagement.
 - The selection criteria may not be based on the marks of the winners but on other criteria such as the suitability of the repertoire for the CBSO's concert season.
 - If no soloists are selected from the current festival, the CCCTIMF organizing committee can recommend previous festival winners for the concerto performance engagement for the CBSO's consideration in their concert season.
 - CBSO Music Director's decision is considered final.





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10. Gala Concert and Awards Ceremony

- 10.1 Signature trophy winners and selected first prize winners will be invited to perform in the Gala Concert and Awards Ceremony at the P.C. Ho Theatre in Toronto, Canada. The P.C. Ho Theatre is a 626-seat state-of-the-art concert hall and the crown jewel of Toronto (https://www.cccgt.org/book-an-event/p-c-ho-theatre/).
- 10.2 Winners not invited to perform in the Gala Concert and Awards Ceremony may be invited to perform at the subsequent "Rising Star" concerts in Toronto, Canada.
- 10.3 Invited performers are required to perform their winning piece. Any substitute piece requires prior approval from the Festival Committee.
- 10.4 All first prize winners from each class will receive one complimentary ticket to attend the Gala Concert and Awards Ceremony. Additional tickets can be purchased from the festival.
- 10.5 Winners who are unable to attend the Gala Concert and Awards Ceremony can pick up their trophies, medals, and scholarships at the CCC in person; or winners may request to have their awards delivered via courier for an additional fee not included in the registration.

11. OMFA Provincial Level Nomination

- 11.1 Participants with outstanding performances will have the opportunity to be nominated for the OMFA Provincial competition held in 2025 with an adjudicator recommendation. Participants should be aware that 2 pieces at the same level of current study are required for the OMFA. Please check the OMFA Provincial website (<u>www.omfa.ca</u>).
- 11.2 For all classes in the CCCTIMF Special Syllabus except for the Concerto, Chinese Composer, Duet Classes, and Masterclass, if you would like to be nominated for the OMFA Provincial level festivals; you need to make sure that the repertoire you are performing is listed in the RCM syllabus. Please check the OMFA Provincial website (www.omfa.ca).
- 11.3 All online classes are not eligible for the OMFA Provincial level Nominations.
- 11.4 It is the participant's responsibility to be familiar with the Provincial Festival rules & repertoire requirements. CCCTIMF assumes no responsibility for an entrant meeting or failing to meet these requirements. For information, please refer to the OMFA Provincial website (<u>www.OMFA.ca</u>)





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12. Cancellation

- 12.1 In case of any unforeseeable events, the Festival Committee reserves the right to postpone, cancel, or change the schedule of the festival.
- 12.2 Festival classes with less than three participants may be combined or cancelled at the discretion of the CCCTIMF Artistic Committee.

13. Authorization, Waiver and Release

- 13.1 By participating in the CCCTIMF, the participant provides authorization for CCC and CCCTIMF to use any audio, video, or any other multimedia recordings submitted to the Festival Committee for participation in the festival by or on behalf of the participant, in whatever form or manner, and any recordings of the participant's music performance made by CCCTIMF during the festival, in private or public sessions ("the Work") to promote and publicize the festival and any future festivals, to perform the Work during or after the festival, and to reproduce, exhibit, display, broadcast, distribute and create derivative work of the Work for any non-commercial purposes, including education, promoting CCC and CCCTIMF and fundraising for CCC.
- 13.2 The participant also provides authorization for CCCTIMF to photograph, film and/or record the participant during or in connection with the festival and/or any CCC and CCCTIMF public events and consent to the use of the participant's name, likeness, images, and recordings (the "name and photographic images") in any and all CCC and CCCTIMF publications, information and educational materials, and social media and web materials for the purpose of promoting CCC and CCCTIMF.
- 13.3 The participant further waives all moral rights in the Work in favor of CCC and releases CCC and CCC's employees, volunteers, directors, officers, advisors, sponsors, CCCTIMF-appointed adjudicators, and their respective assigns and successors from any and all claims that may arise in connection with the use of the Work and/or the name and photographic images, including any claims of defamation, invasion of privacy, or copyright.

14. Miscellanea

14.1 CCC is a registered Canadian not-for-profit organization. Donations over \$20 CAD will receive a Canadian income tax receipt (https://www.paypal.com/donate?hosted_button_id=FPGEWNEYJCMZC).
